***Therapy Abroad and the Biola Communications Sciences & Disorders program have designed a 9-Day faculty-led program For June 15-23, 2019!***

This program was designed for students who want to take advantage of working alongside professional ASHA accredited speech-language pathologists (SLPs) and Biola Faculty in order to gain hands-on experience in a real world setting, practice, observe, and learn more about Speech-language pathology, gain deeper insight into grad school curriculum, travel and learn more about a new culture.

Students will provide essential services such as speech & language screenings, formal assessments, informal assessments, diagnostics, and therapy sessions for school aged children. Students will also participate in a home health community based rehabilitation program and other activities designed to increase cultural competencies. Each day students will have group discussion as well as one on one time with faculty and other professionals. You will learn, observe, share ideas, and work on developing critical skills.
